As a cultural center, the museum strives to honor the legacy of Miss Lucy Craft Laney through innovative, informative and inspiring programming, which in turn contributes to the vibrancy of the community.

## Revival of the Laney Museum's August Wilson Theatrical Reading Series

The Fall quarter was packed with a host of programs, including a relaunch of the August Wilson theatrical reading series which debuted at the museum during the tenure of former executive director Christine Miller Betts. From 2004 to 2006 Jerome Preston Bates, Augusta native, Broadway, Hollywood and TV actor, directed 9 of 10 plays from the August Wilson Century Cycle Series. For 2024, Bates collaborated with the museum to direct and act in two of those plays, "Seven Guitars" and "King Hedley II". Both plays were well received by the community and the museum was delighted to showcase some of Augusta's talent, including Russell Joel Brown, Chris Lowe, Tarika Holland and Shantelle Wheeler.

#### Frank Yerby Week

The museum celebrated the literary contributions of prolific writer Frank Yerby with a three day, four-event celebration that included the unveiling of the Frank Yerby author's bench, located in the museum's garden; a screening of his book "The Foxes of Harrow", the first book by an African American to be adapted into a Hollywood screenplay; a discussion of his book, "A Woman Called Fancy"; and an honorary street naming, Hall Street to Frank Yerby Street.





#### **Recent Art Exhibits:**

In its annual "Emerging Artists" exhibit, the museum displayed the artworks of 11 artists from the River Region, including students from T.W Josey high school.

Currently on exhibit through November is "Breaking Barriers: Women Who Impacted the Arts". Painting in styles reflective of each of the 15 featured artists, Augusta's Rhian Swain pays tribute to these influential women by ingeniously incorporating each woman's images into the paintings. She will be giving an Artist Talk on Sunday November 24th from 3pm - 4pm. Posters and coffee mugs with images from her paintings will be available for purchase.







#### First Tuesdays Journaling Club

In September, the museum launched its First Tuesday's Journaling Club, led by award-winning writer Cheryl Corbin (Olivia Gaines). Journaling topics to date have been "gratefulness" and "mindfulness". December and January themes are "reflective journaling" and "goal journaling", respectively. Corbin says "Mindful journaling can be a powerful tool for self-discovery and personal growth. This practice can help increase self-awareness, reduce stress, and improve emotional well-being." #### In Memoriam: Dr. Ruth B. Crawford

The Lucy Craft Laney Museum of Black History celebrates the life of Dr. Ruth B. Crawford who passed away in October. Dr. Crawford had many accomplishments to her name, including turning 109 years old this past May. Dr. Crawford, a Paine College alumnus, was well-loved and well-known for her contributions to the Augusta community, which include her leadership of the Shiloh Community Center for 30 years and as an educator where she touched the lives of countless youth for 38 years. Dr. Crawford is featured on the art mural "Women of Empowerment", located in the historic Laney-Walker neighborhood at 1119 James Brown Boulevard.

#### In Memoriam: Mrs. Caffee Wright

The Lucy Craft Laney Museum remembers Mrs. Caffee Wright who volunteered as a horticulturist for the museum for two years and was a horticulturist at the Augusta National Golf Course. Mrs. Wright enjoyed taking care of the variety of plants and flowers in the museum's garden and took great pride in preparing the garden for the installation of the recently installed Frank Yerby Authors Bench.

#### In Memoriam: Mr. Jimmy Dukes, Jr.

The Lucy Craft Laney Museum of Black History is grateful for the service of Mr. Jimmy Dukes, who passed away in September. Mr. Dukes was the owner of Metro Termite and Pest Control and served as the museum's exterminator for several years. He was an educator and administrator in the Richmond County School system, and a graduate of Paine College, where as a student, he was actively involved in the 1960s civil rights movement.
